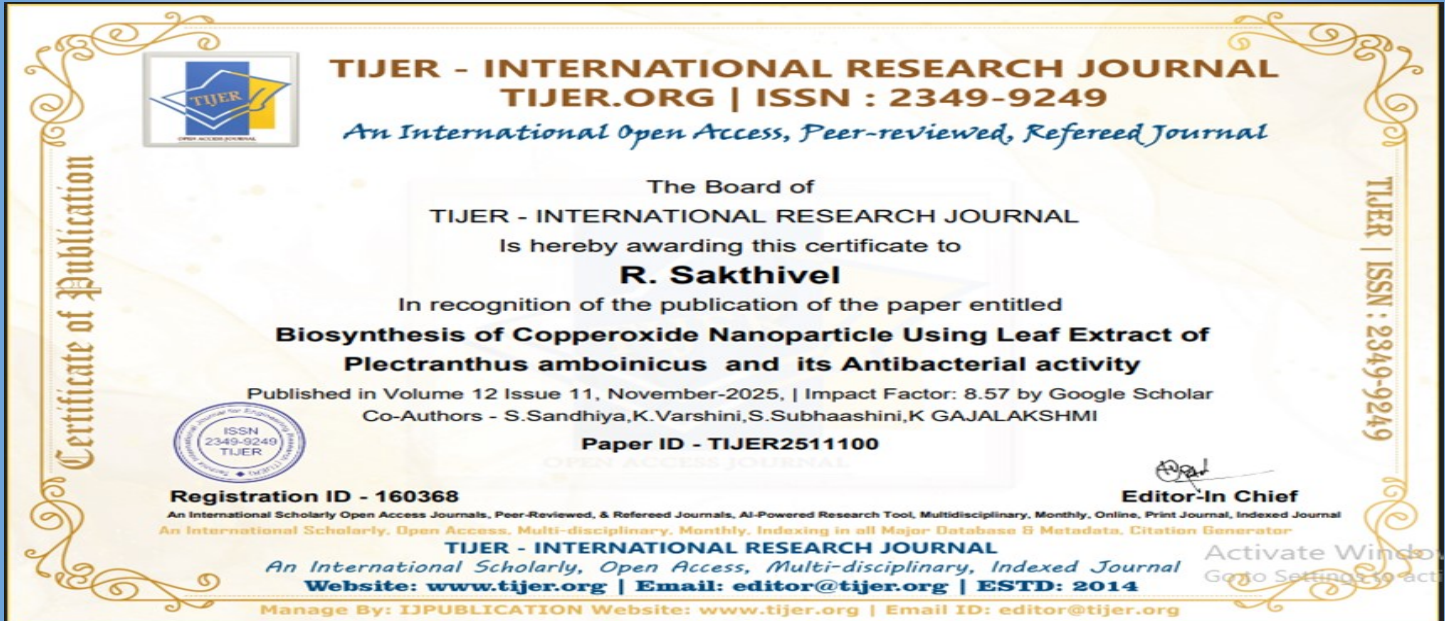



DOCTORAL COMMITTEE MEETING

Social Work Department (Presenting)

Key Drivers of Vulnerability

- The main factors increasing vulnerability at household and community levels include: Covid 19 Poverty, Food Security, Gender Inequality, and Weak social networks.
- These factors heighten exposure to economic, social, and health-related shocks, reducing overall resilience.
- Statistical Validation:
 - Bartlett's Test of Sphericity ($\chi^2 = 236.1, p < 0.001$) → Highly significant, confirming that correlations among variables were sufficient for factor analysis.
 - Interpretation: Data were statistically appropriate for identifying underlying factors driving vulnerability.
- Kendall's $\tau = 0.64, p < 0.01$:
 - Indicates a strong, positive, and significant correlation between household and community vulnerability.
 - Interpretation: When household vulnerability increases, community vulnerability rises as well — highlighting the interconnected nature of social fragility.
- Insight: Addressing poverty, gender inequality, and weak social networks is critical to strengthening both household and community resilience within the SCTP framework.

Key drivers of vulnerability: The findings identify poverty, food insecurity, gender inequality, and weak networks as the main factors increasing vulnerability at the household and community level. This means that households or communities facing these conditions are more likely to experience social and economic hardships, making them less resilient to shocks such as economic downturns, disasters or health crises.

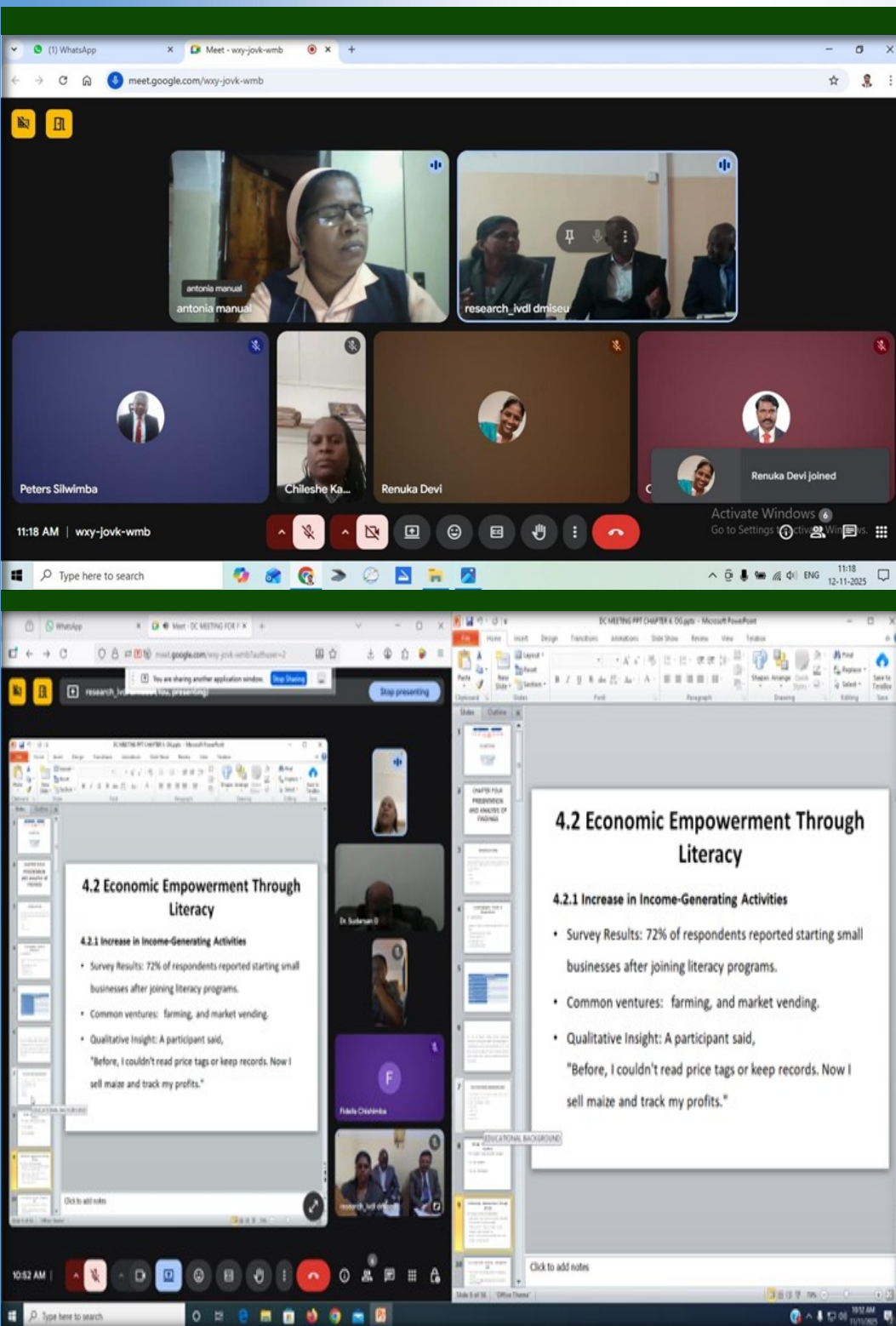

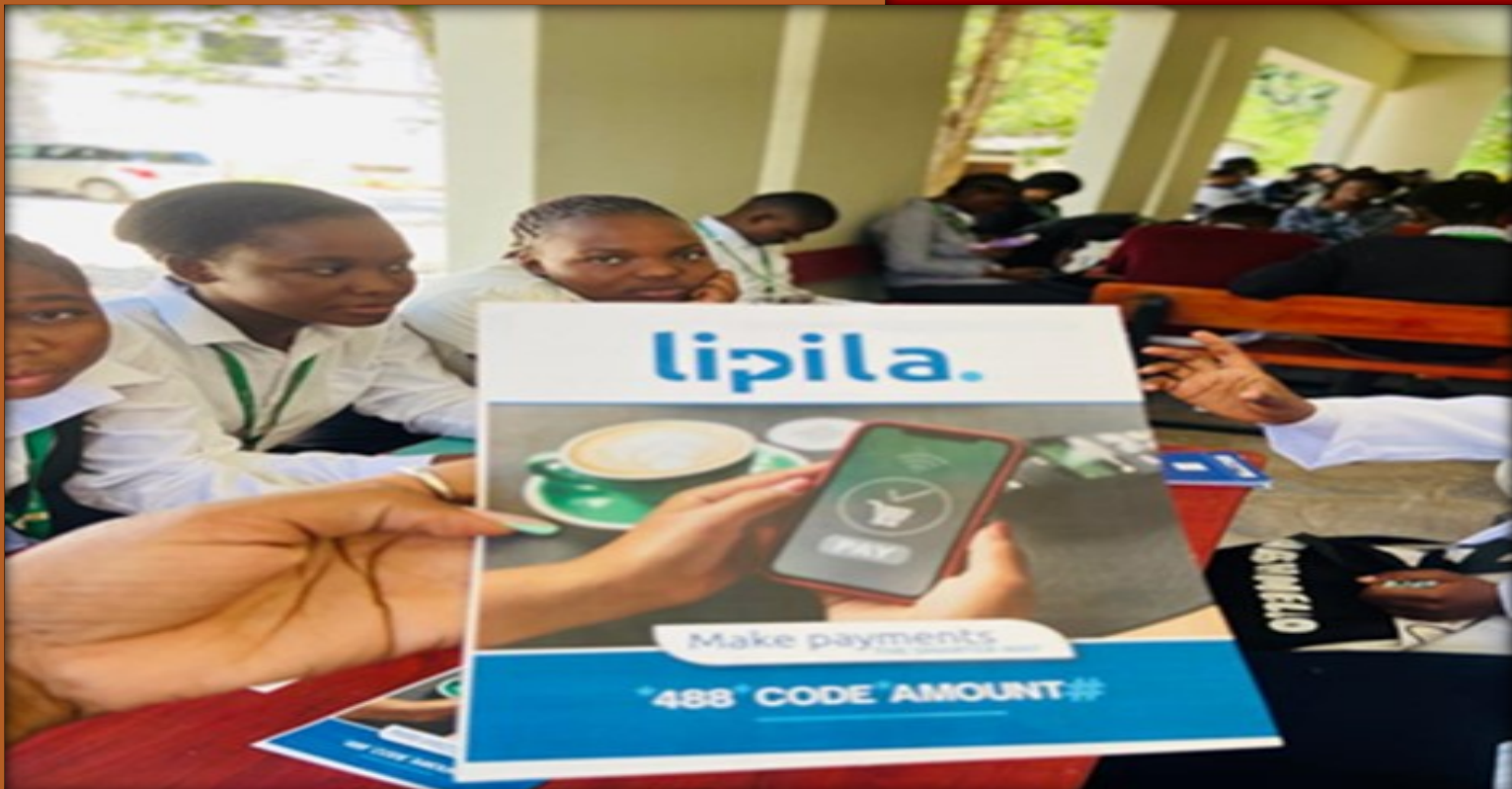
